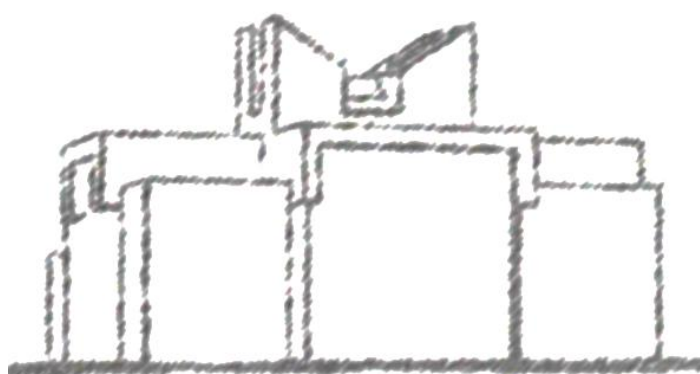

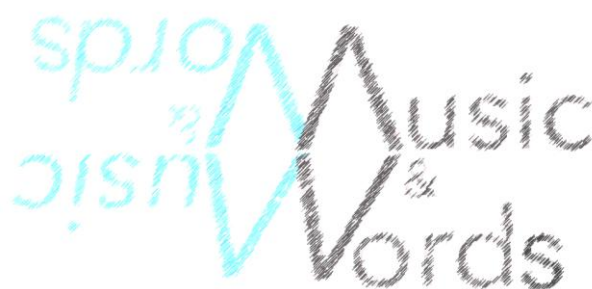

Inter Alios Choir

The Inter Alios choir perform every Sunday of term, alternating between choral Evensong and a unique 'Music & Words' event which combines choral music, poetry and a short address. 'Inter Alios' translates as 'among others' and speaks to the collective spirit of the choir: inter-faith, inter-collegiate, and international. In our programming we seek to juxtapose well-known choral works with contemporary repertoire, particularly music by women composers.

The choir welcomes singers with a wide range of experience. Our members are mostly un-auditioned, but we have an auditioned Chamber Choir including Choral Scholars at our core.
